Flower Mart

All Hallows Guild has sponsored the popular two-day Flower Mart festival since 1939. Plants, herbs, foods, puppet shows, carousel rides, boutiques and entertainment are offered on the cathedral close on Friday and Saturday, the first weekend in May. Each year one of Washington's embassies is featured, providing the theme for the occasion. Flower Mart is recognized throughout the metropolitan area as Washington's premier spring outdoor festival.

1890s Carousel

The guild's century-old carousel, now on the National Register of Historic Places, is a favorite of young and old. Lovingly restored, each hand-painted animal is a work of art with special significance. The carousel is operated at Flower Mart in the spring and on other special occasions.

All Hallows Guild was founded by Florence Brown Bratenahl in 1916 as the garden guild for the lovely 59 acres surrounding Washington National Cathedral. Mrs. Bratenahl's mission is alive and well today. The Guild, working closely with the Cathedral's horticultural staff, preserves and beautifies this historic landscape while increasing public awareness through docent-led garden tours and woods walks, the publication of materials and the presentation of special programs. Fundraising activities, membership dues, and memorial gifts enable the guild to spend an average of \$350,000 annually to maintain and improve the Cathedral landscape. We invite you to visit the gardens and woods to experience the beauty and serenity that are afforded all visitors.

Garden Tours

Guild docents offer visitors a one-hour tour of the gardens from April 1 through October 31. Regularly scheduled tours depart from the Herb Cottage on most Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. Self-guided tour brochures available in the Cottage. Olmsted Woods Walks

When landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted, Jr., designed the Washington National Cathedral's 59-acre Close nearly 100 years ago, much of the surrounding area was country. Now, encroachment and overuse have become serious threats to its survival. A 1996 study commissioned by All Hallows Guild concluded that the Olmsted Woods "are faced with extinction if action is not taken soon." A long-term restoration plan was enacted; funds were energetically raised, and the work was completed in 2007 with the rebuilding of the new beautiful outdoor All Hallows Amphitheater. Educational tours and programs (including bird-walks) appropriate to the season are offered to the public.
